Watch for the snowy buildup that collects on your car and your concrete from the plowing of streets as well. As it melts, the commercial chemicals used on roadways make contact with your concrete.

Products that can cause damage include:

- Salts
- · Calcium Chloride
- Anti-icing/De-icing Chemicals
- Fertilizers

Concrete Alberta recommends the use of high-quality traction sand on exterior driveways and walkways to prevent slips, trips, and falls.

In order to maintain the look and integrity of your concrete long-term, Concrete Alberta recommends proper sealing of the concrete surface with a Silane penetrating sealer.
